What's news at KGP?

You might have heard that, since August 2025, Ausgold recently purchased properties at and around the proposed Katanning Gold Project (KGP). These properties span over an additional 1,450 hectares and open a range of possibilities for the future. A sizeable proportion of the acquired land coincides with granted mining tenements. While the exact use of some of these properties is still to be determined, it could potentially support the project in various ways, including providing open spaces, vegetated buffers, water exploration, extra mining areas and space for waste rock storage (pending further studies and approvals). Having this extra land helps plan for environmental offsets and any future extensions to the mine's life.

We've also kicked off a drilling campaign in October 2025 across the project to continue developing our understanding of the site and planning for the mining operation. This campaign is programmed to deliver over 40,000 linear metres of drilling to give better definition of mineralised ground to add to minable gold ounces.

The news was formally announced to the public in late October that Ausgold was seeking to lease Shire of Katanning land, as Ausgold's intention is to develop a workforce accommodation facility.

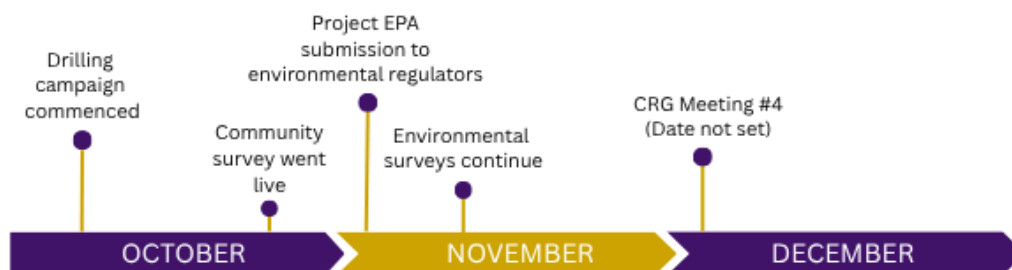
Ausgold submission to the environmental regulator

In June 2025, we lodged our project submission to the Federal Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment and Water (DCCEEW) on the [EPBC Act Public Portal](#). The submission was open to public comment as part of being assessed by the regulator.

The KGP will be assessed by DCCEEW at the level of Assessment on Preliminary Documentation. A request for information was received by the Ausgold in September 2025 and it is currently working on further studies and supporting investigations to provide further information to complete the APD submission. The final content of the APD will be lodged with DCCEEW in Q1 2026. If anything else changes, we will let you know.

The State's Environmental Protection Authority will receive Ausgold's S38 referral in November 2025.

About the Katanning Gold Project

The KGP is Ausgold's flagship project. We are located 275km south-east of Perth and about 40km north-east of Katanning, in the southwest of Western Australia. Katanning is the closest regional centre, and other KGP communities include Nyabing, Dumbleyung, Badgebup and Woodanilling.

Gold was first discovered in the area in 1979 and was mined briefly from December 1995 to July 1997. About 20,000 ounces of gold were produced during this time. Since acquiring the project in 2010, Ausgold has been working on 'proving up' (measuring and confirming) the gold resource at over 3 million ounces (Moz) and reserves at 1.2Moz based on additional exploration studies.
